**W**e are celebrating the 40 (plus!) years' anniversary for many homes in Bonnie Brae. Some homes are a little older and some a little younger but the first BBCA Newsletter went out on November 26, 1973 and this actually marks our 50th issue! BBCA homes continue to remain a statement of contemporary 70's architecture. Dubbed as California Contemporary designs, Bonnie Brae still stands out in Northern VA.

As you walk through the Bonnie Brae neighborhood, enjoy how so many of our loving homeowners have stayed true to the original look of the homes with careful updating and modernization. BBCA sponsors a Home Show every two years. Remember, we are looking for owners to open their homes this year for our 2016 Home Tour. As President, I receive many BBCA resident's comments and questions. One of the most commented on issues happen to be "trash cans left on the curb". Fairfax County Code requires household trash and recyclables to be collected weekly. To ensure collection, please have it at the curb or street line by 6 a.m. on your collection day. You are required to have a plastic container to hold your trash and recycling items, and yard waste must be in closed plastic or paper waste bags. At the end of the day, the trash container should be brought back into your garage, carport, or designated storage area.

Bonnie Brae has a great reputation as a well maintained neighborhood which makes for excellent real estate values. Please help the visual look of your street by cleaning your yard this spring, keeping your grass mowed, and trimming or replacing overgrown landscaping. Take a critical look at your yard and replace or repair as needed.

Check this newsletter for our activity schedule which is full of opportunities for all ages. Please join us and meet your neighbors. We have had several activities presented in the past and the successful ones are ones that have a good sponsor. If you think there is a need for a new activity, contact a board member to discuss it.

# Keeping a Watchful Eye: Bonnie Brae Neighborhood Watch

Since 1982, Bonnie Brae has had an ongoing Neighborhood Watch Program. It wouldn't happen without our volunteers. Many thanks from all of us to all the Bonnie Brae individuals who volunteer once a year to help keep our neighborhood safe.

*Additional volunteers are always needed, and we invite you to consider this once-a-year volunteer commitment.*

## What is involved in Neighborhood Watch?

- ✦ Choose the Friday or Saturday night you are able to participate
- ✦ Patrol our neighborhood by car for 2 hours
- Magnetic signs for your car identify you as our NHW volunteer
- Drive through all the streets in Bonnie Brae, both sides of Sideburn Rd.
- Enjoy a quiet, usually uninterrupted drive with your spouse, partner or a friend
- Report any suspicious activity to the local police – 911 for emergencies; 703-691-2131 for non-emergencies
- ✦ Write a brief entry into the Log Book (usually "All quiet")
- ✦ Pass the NHW supply box with magnetic car signs, flashlights, log book, etc., to the next volunteer
- ✦ Receive the gratitude of all the families who reside in Bonnie Brae

While our community is generally quiet and crime-free, occasionally we hear about incidents that get our attention, including vandalism, damage to cars parked outside, and stolen holiday decorations to name just a few. Neighborhood Watch has proven to be an effective program that contributes to preventing local crime. Because of our consistent participation in the NHW Program over 34 years, Bonnie Brae has earned the respect of the Crime Prevention Section at our West Springfield District Police Station.



We use the online scheduling tool, **Sign-Up Genius** -- so you can select the date most convenient for you. Sign-Up Genius will send you a reminder email 5 days ahead of the date you signed up for. If you need to change the date, you can easily make the change through this website. It is easy to use, and most importantly, safe and secure.
